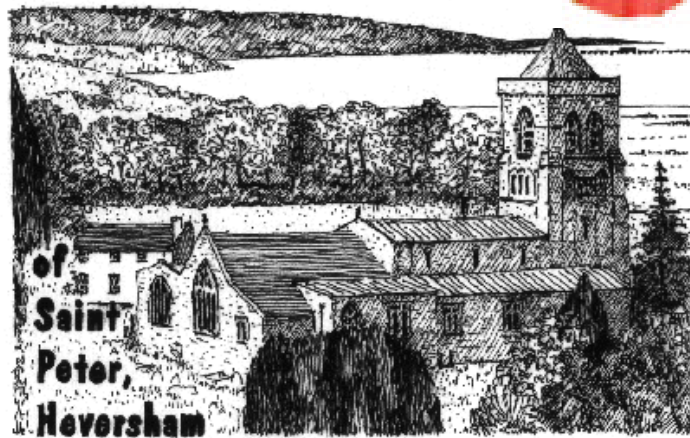

My Dear Friends,

Should British troops be sent north from Basra to fill in behind USA forces, and who makes the decision? As I write the decision is probably being made. For certain the decision will not be taken by the troops. They will either stay near Basra or be sent north. They will have no choice.

Soldiers on enlisting take an oath of obedience to the Queen and accept that from then on they are soldiers 24/7 - there is never a time when they are not soldiers and every order is obeyed regardless of their personal feelings. There is no other way that an army can function. We use the word 'discipline' which means learning by following the leadership and then doing.

Why do I start like that? Simply because it gives a clue to Christian discipleship. At baptism very solemn vows and promises are made to God, we enlist as soldiers of The Kingdom and we receive His commission and authority to be 'His faithful soldiers and servants to our life's end' - no time off, 24/7, for life. But we have gone AWOL (Absent WithOut Leave), forgotten our promises and deserted. It might have been better to have been honest and not to have made them in the first place.

If we have been baptised and do not become disciples receiving the teaching and training necessary to be Christ's faithful soldiers and servants we are showing scant regard for The King, Jesus. No soldier can behave like that and get away with it thinking that one day (at their choosing) they may get round to fulfilling a few of the duties when it suits them, and that all will be well. Yet we imagine that we can 'enlist' in God's family, the Church, ignore the discipleship and expect our heavenly 'pension' at the end.

Advent, which starts on 28th. November, focuses our minds on Jesus' return and says that what He is looking for is faith. That is trust in, reliance on, belief in and commitment to Him. That doesn't come without discipleship. So when, not if (be sure of that), Jesus returns will He find faith in us?

That is faith nurtured by discipleship in fulfilment of our Baptismal promises - or will we miss out because we went AWOL? Advent is a time to think and pray about these eternal issues. Unfortunately it is regarded by many as just a time to prepare for celebrating Jesus' coming at Christmas. It is most certainly about Jesus' coming - His second Coming in Glory!

Stop going AWOL, give yourself up! There is a King's Pardon for repentant disciples.

May the Lord bless you and keep you.

The important topic of the meeting was the response to the Bishop's Survival to Revival Project, and agreed that work with young people should be the main priority.

SERVE INDONESIA - 7th July - 15th August 2004

I was blessed to visit Medan in Northern Sumatera this summer and share in the life of some OMF missionaries. It was a real eye-opener to meet folks working in the field and appreciate their joys and sacrifices. I was grateful for the constant prayer support of the church and friends via the miracle of email.

How to sum it up? The **highs** must include the wonderful students. I was there on a short term programme, *Serve Indonesia*, to help on an intensive English course (**KIBI**) at STT ABDI SABDA ('Servant of the Word') college in Medan, founded by 6 local denominations to prepare Christian teachers and church leaders to go out strong in faith, love and knowledge. I stayed amongst the banana plantations in the hot, wet humidity with an old friend who has been in Indonesia with OMF for 32 years and who teaches at the college. Most of the students are Batak and they were thirsty to learn and to deepen their faith. Their ancestors were head hunters, converted to Christianity in the 19th century. Mercifully they left their headhunting knives at home! They are famous for their musical ability. They had the tune of 'We Believe' in minutes though none reads music off the stave! The timbre of their deep voices is the sound of south sea islanders which gave us goosebumps! I also spent a day at volcanic Lake Toba, visiting traditional Simalungan-Batak villages untouched by tourism. There is a display at St. Peter's & information about how you might help **OMF Serve Asia** short term in the far east. *Thelma Mitchell*
