



A letter from the Vicar, The Revd Canon John Hancock

My Dear Friends,

Just a few days after Easter we come to All Fools Day. It causes great amusement among the young of all ages - so long as someone else is the 'fool'. It comes at a time when we are celebrating Jesus' rising from the dead - something the women who followed Jesus announced but which the men dismissed as nonsense. The men were not going to be taken in and be fools. Yet a few years later St. Paul picked up this word 'fools' and said that the followers of Jesus should be prepared to be 'fools for Christ'. This did not mean that they were believing nonsense but that they must be prepared to suffer ridicule, even martyrdom, for their conviction that it was true that Jesus was alive, risen from the dead.

Jesus' rising again is no trick, illusion or invention - it is a fact. What is amazing is that many will accept as fact other things which are based on far less evidence and far fewer witnesses. But these other things do not carry the same 'ridicule factor'. A considerable number of people witnessed the Risen Jesus among them - the women, the disciples (eventually) and many others including on one occasion over five hundred followers (see 1 Corinthians 15: 6). These are facts that we cannot ignore. The problem that many have is that Jesus, his death and resurrection, like his teaching and deeds, are so divisive. People like everything levelled down to a common acceptable level where no offence is caused and no challenge is issued. Not long ago a vicar was threatened by his local council with legal action under Race Relations legislation because there was a poster outside his church which read 'Jesus said, I am the Way, the Truth and the Life. No one comes to the Father except by me'. It was alleged to be offensive to non-Christians. But isn't that the point? St. Paul said just that - the Gospel (Good News) was foolishness, a stumbling block and an offence. The danger today is that the Church tries to make the Gospel so palatable that it ceases to have any cutting edge, so acceptable that it is not worth receiving and so inoffensive that no one is disturbed.

We have a Gospel to proclaim in a society which is increasingly indifferent and resistant to it. We may risk being April Fools for twelve hours but the challenge to us all is that we should proclaim the truth about Jesus, crucified and risen, and joyfully run the risk of being thought fools - Fools for Christ for life.

The Risen Jesus wants to meet with each one of us. What about our meeting him?

With every blessing from one fool to! (You fill in the gap!) Yours in his service.

THE CHRISMON TREE

You are all invited to come along to the **Easter Day service**

at St Peter's to put a fresh daffodil on a cross made from the trunk of our Chrismon Tree. This is the tree which was decorated at Christmas wholly with Christian symbols – white for purity, gold for majesty and tiny white lights to remind us that Jesus is the 'Light of the World.'

After Christmas the tree was stripped of its branches and made into a crude cross which has been standing in Church during Lent.

On Easter Day, it is converted from a bare cross into a cross of glory by decorating it with daffodils – a strong reminder that the Jesus story does not end at Christmas.

Appointment of the new incumbent following the retirement of The Revd Canon John Hancock at the end of July

The Archdeacon of Carlisle, Dr David Thomson, held a joint meeting of both **Heversham and Milnthorpe PCCs** at Milnthorpe on March 9th to help our two parishes to start the process of appointing the next priest. Also present were representatives of the other parishes in the proposed Kent Estuary team.

The official procedures were explained and all were impressed by Dr Thomson's understanding of the difficulties that can be encountered in a joint benefice - and in a team of very different parishes.

A joint PCC meeting was held later and it was decided to proceed straight away with compiling a benefice prayer to be used over the coming weeks, an idea of Dr Thomson's which all thought would be very helpful.

Each parish will start to compile those parts of the Parish Profile, which are distinctive to their own church and parish, and to gather relevant photographs. A 'Section 11' meeting has been arranged for April 11th when both PCCs will pool their thoughts on the particular qualities needed by a future priest for this benefice, and instruct a small group to finalise that, write a common introduction and combine the rest of the data.

We plan to have the Profile finished by the week beginning April 18th, which should give time to have copies printed and posted to the Bishops, Archdeacons, Rural Dean and our Patron, Dr Arnold Brown of Trinity College, Cambridge, by the end of the month.

A 'Section 12' Meeting with the Bishop, the Archdeacon of Westmorland and Furness, the Rural Dean, both PCCs and the Kent Estuary parish representatives will be held at Milnthorpe on May 9th to consider the Profile.

The post could be advertised at the end of May, interviews could be in early July and the new incumbent could start by the end of October.

St John's, Levens – Annual Meetings, Tuesday 8th March

These, the Vestry and Annual Parochial Church preceded by an open PCC meeting, were well attended. The PCC meeting mainly studied the Annual Accounts which were then later adopted by the full annual meeting. The accounts did show a quite healthy excess of income over expenditure but it was pointed out that this was only because of a £10,000 legacy during 2003 and a £3,000 donation from a charitable foundation with which a parishioner has connections. Without this input the parish would be considerably in the red. At the vestry meeting there were no candidates for election as churchwardens at this date. Without churchwardens the parish is illegal and cannot function so, after some serious discussion, it was agreed to suspend this meeting and reconvene on Tuesday 12 April 2005 7.30 in the Institute, in the deep and prayerful hope that two people then, be will. by willing churchwardens. The Annual Meeting was. of course, much overshadowed by this situation but still managed to look back over a year which had had its strong points and its fun, much of this due to the work of Moira Tombs, who returned to the parish for this meeting. Grateful thanks were expressed to all those who so willingly and dependably undertake tasks around and for the church to keep it open and usable for all those who use it whether regularly Sunday by Sunday or for occasional purposes. These numerous name individually but one example this year was Mr Richard Brennan who regretfully

announced that he must give up his job of emptying the Children's Society collecting boxes which are distributed around some homes in the parish, last year producing just over £560 for the Society. He's only done the job for 47 years (yes, 47)! He was thanked most sincerely for his efforts. Mrs Anne Perrett has agreed to take on this duty but is not sure she will manage 47 years herself.

At the February meeting Mrs Bette Kissack's slide talk "California – The Golden Circle" covered the first half of an Golden Circle" covered the first half of an epic coach tour, taken with her husband Harry. Flying into Los Angeles, their 1st port of call was San Diego, a large naval base near the Mexican border. The local wildlife (seals, sealions & pelicans) enjoy a lazy life. Not so tourists; there is too much to see! Elegant Spanish buildings, weird modern skyscrapers, the Colorado bridge & open air museum, the busy harbour, markets, & fine 3 masted sailing ship, built in Ramsey, IOM, in 1863. The once hazardous desert crossing is effortless on the modern roads. & the scenery breathtaking. After stops to see historic sites, & dune racing, they reached the Grand Canyon. We shard Bette's bird's eye view of this wonderful place, from a small plane, & saw intrepid walkers and mule riders, well wrapped up from the cold, ascending steep canyon trails from the river far below. This awesome engineering feat, supplying water & electricity to seven states, sadly cost 98 lives, commemorated by a fine monument. Crossing the Dam from the Arizona side to Nevada, you put vour watch back an hour (& can have lunch twice, said Harry). Bette & Harry left us marvelling at Las Vegas, a modern desert mirage where you can visit "Venice" or a "volcano" & win (or lose ...) a fortune! We hope to hitch another ride with them sometime, as they head for San Francisco to complete the "Golden Circle".

More News

OUR NEW COVER has been designed by Daphne Lester who has had several illustrated maps hung in the Milnthorpe Art Exhibition. We are delighted with this original parish news cover. Ed Team.

This map drawn for our new HLM Parish News really illustrates how we are linked together.

The Bells: In 1869 three steel bells were acquired by St Thomas' Church and were given to Levens church in 1912. The three bells are still at Levens church, not in the tower but in a timber frame in the churchyard near the north-west corner of the church. The 7th cross-shaft is situated in the porch at St Peter's Church. St Anthony's Tower is a landmark seen from all directions when approaching Milnthorpe.
