



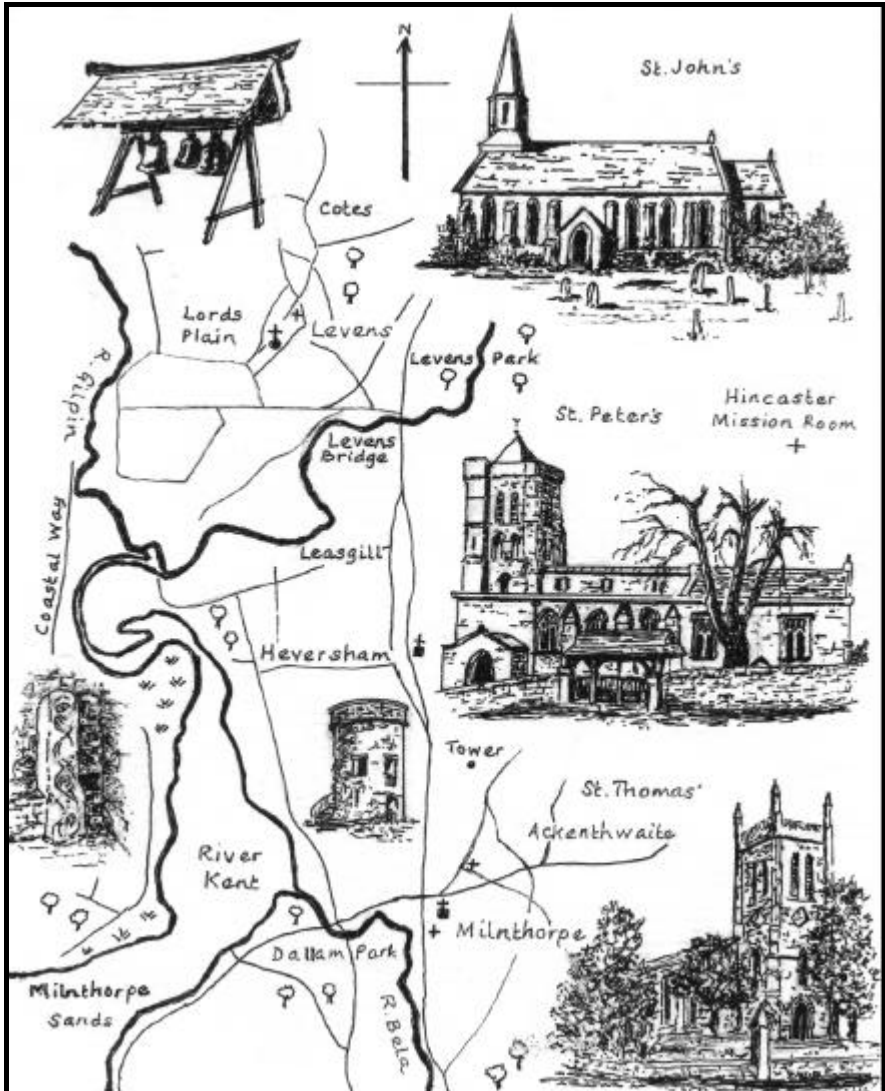

A letter from the Vicar, The Revd Canon John Hancock

My Dear Friends,

Recently I came across an article by a woman who suffered from insomnia. In it she described her fears and worries and the uncontrollable thoughts which raced through her mind like 'a load of laundry in the tumble dryer'. It was a problem, she was told, that she would have to learn to live with.

She prayed constantly that God would help her by curing her of her insomnia - but God did not! He did, however, answer her prayers but not in the way she was asking. As she lay awake asking for healing God gave her relief by leading her to re-name the complaint in such a way that it was not an illness but an opportunity. She no longer suffered from insomnia. She possessed something positive called 'wakefulness', and saw it as a friend. It gave her time to pray and read her Bible and other books, to plan and to reflect. She no longer suffered loneliness but enjoyed solitude in which her soul was refreshed.

I think there is something in this for us all, because we are inclined to look at things negatively. Some setback occurs, some unpleasant diagnosis is received and we cannot do what we had planned so we can so easily ask 'Why does God allow it to happen?' - blaming God for the problem. But God did not 'send' it or 'cause' it. I believe that God is right in there with us trying to help us, bringing good out of the misfortune, getting us to look not at the paths it closes but at the avenues it opens, and showing us that disappointment can blossom into opportunities and insights. If there is going to be any question it should be 'What can God help me to learn in all this?' This way we are in for some glorious surprises.

With every blessing.

Special Meeting with VIPs

The Rt. Revd Graham Dow, Bishop of Carlisle, acted as Chairman at a full joint meeting of St Thomas' and St Peter's PCC members, held at St Thomas' Church Centre. He welcomed all, especially the Revd Doctor Arnold Browne, Dean of Trinity College Cambridge, the Ven George Howe, Archdeacon and the Revd Nigel Davies, Rural Dean. He said the purpose of the meeting was to continue discussion of the appointment of a new Minister for Heversham and Milnthorpe parishes. Statements towards this had been prepared in the two parishes, with profiles made for each church ready for the applicant. Copies of these were viewed at the meeting along with discussion, and followed by statements by the Bishop.



At the May meeting of Milnthorpe-with-Heversham MU, Joan Ellam led the service, and introduced Matt Taylor of NISCU, who gave the Bible reading on the Parable of the Sower. He later gave a presentation of the work done in schools of South Lakeland, and introduced his co-worker Paula Pearson, who also spoke. They visit 46 schools in the area, presenting Christianity with the Bible to children at assemblies, youth clubs, Quest Clubs, other occasions and also organise Summer Camps. Both were thanked by Pat Radcliffe.

During the business meeting Mrs Ellam said that letters of thanks had been received from Furness and Lancaster hospitals for the 'gowns of love', also for donations to the Away from It All Holiday Scheme. MU Deanery Leader Shirley Payne had visited

Zululand and had seen much suffering and poverty there.

On May 10th, several members had visited Liverpool and attended a service at the Cathedral – the sermon by the Revd Canon Toby Forward had included much praise for the worldwide work of the MU.

The closing meeting on June 8th at 2pm at St Peter's Church will be a service of Holy Communion, conducted by the Revd Bob Wilkinson and followed by tea.

Members are asked to bring savouries/cakes etc towards this.

The New Youth Club

continues enthusiastically, and has held the young peoples' committee elections. The secret ballot resulted in – from School Year 10 – Matt Watts; Yr 8 – Greg Knight; Yr 7 – Becky Waites and Jack Lashley. The committee will be involved in steering club activities and arranging fund events.

More than eighty Senior Citizens

attended their annual Party, held at the Memorial Hall, and enjoyed a delicious High Tea of ham and chicken salad, scones, cakes and trifle prepared by the Senior Citizens' Party Committee. Later a display of ballet dancing was given by the children of Rigney Bank Ballet School, followed by a programme of music and song by Norman Johns of Arnside. Oldest lady present was Mrs Margaret Jackson and oldest man being Mr Alfred Richardson; each received a large basket of fruit. Thanks are expressed to the special party committee for their work.

Fundraising Staff at Forbuoys Newsagents

recently raised £550 for Breast Cancer Research from their 4 mile walk, and a further £330 towards Christmas on the Green 2005 from their raffle.

The Christmas on the Green Committee

was re-elected at the Residents' meeting along with Chairman Mark James, Secretary Pat Barnes and Treasurer Geoffrey Gregory.

At the recent Residents' Association

meeting, a report from the Police stated that the refurbished Police Station is open with 23 Constables, 3 Sergeants and an Inspector on duty at various times. A Sports Festival organised by Cumbria Police and SLDC is to be held at Wings School, Whasset on Saturday 30th July. 12 local schools have been invited to attend, and compete in a variety of sports. The Army Youth Team will be present and erect an assault course. The event is open to all residing in Milnthorpe, Endmoor, Burton and Arnside areas.

A Public Meeting held on May 4th

attended by over 40 people was to discuss the future of Milnthorpe Memorial Hall, at present without a leaseholder. In attendance were Carl Glynn of Voluntary Action Cumbria, and Gordon Wilson, secretary of the Milnthorpe Memorial Hall Management Committee – who outlined the duties of the hall as a charity, with its Trustees responsible for keeping the rules of the Charity Commission. He detailed its previous and possible use. Questionnaires were circulated and further meetings arranged. The public meeting was followed by a meeting of interested parties with a committee of 20 formed under the name "Friends of the Memorial Hall" – with Chairman Steve Watts; Vice Chairman Helen Lashley; Secretary Dianne Chaplow and Treasurer David Ryder. 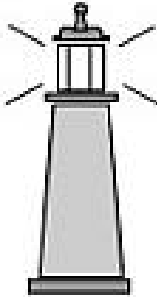

Although Terry's life began in Falmouth his life was an international affair from an early age. His parents served God for most of their years in three countries Chile, Argentina and Paraguay.

Terry was ordained in S. America and pastors San Pedro church in Vina del Mar and oversees several other churches. His other passion is SEAN of which he is International Director. This stands for Study by Extension for All Nations. It was the brainchild of his father, and began in N. Argentina as a programme of self-instructional Christian teaching material in Spanish for local leaders. Now translated into many languages, it has lifted academically deprived people to new heights of achievement.

Pancha is the sister of another S.A.M.S. Mission partner in Chile, Alf Cooper. She and Terry were both widowed before God brought them together in marriage in 1996.

Also pictures of children in an orphanage run by a Malawian who just opened his home to those who had lost their parents mainly due to HIV AIDS. He now has 108 children. Levens Over 60s Club

At the April meeting members enjoyed some virtual time travel when Mr Trevor Hughes gave a slide talk, “Kendal Now & Then – Part 1” Trevor has transferred his entire slide archive to compact disc. A computer controlled projector scans these, re-creating a virtual image on the screen, to which captions, text, dates, etc., can be added. All this technical wizardry, together with Trevor’s infectious enthusiasm, local knowledge, dry humour & interaction with the audience makes for a lively presentation of absorbing interest. Comparison between old engravings, paintings, black & white photos, and present day colour slides gives a vivid picture of the changes that took place, especially during the last century.

We saw some of the fine old buildings that have survived, & some that did not, and heard tales of their owners, architects & builders, and other characters that have left their mark on Kendal’s history. When motor transport replaced horses, many drastic changes began. Old coaching inns closed. The famous King’s Arms became a branch of Marks & Spencer’s (now Bewise). Great clearances took place after WW2 & now shops give way to shopping centres. None of Kendal’s old “yards” now runs down to the river. When the Council demolished New Bank Yard for a car park, the Kendal Civic Society only managed to save one of the unique old houses, but this battle did lead to more cooperation in conservation, as at Colin Croft & Dr Mannings yard. Sadly some worrying changes in this relationship occurred recently. The price of conservation, like liberty, is eternal vigilance!

Levens Women's Institute

Mrs Mary Newell, the April speaker, gave a fascinating slide talk of the thousand year old pilgrim route of 900 miles from the Auvergne district of France over the Pyrenees to Santiago in Spain, in honour of the Apostle, St James, whose tomb is in the Cathedral of the latter. Some people do a shortened version, but Mary and her husband did the full version in 2001 – 2002, though he was 80 years old. No cars are allowed and everything has to be carried in rucksacks, so they travelled light. They usually found accommodation in refuges, youth hostels or monasteries, but when these were very rough they occasionally had the luxury of an hotel. In one refuge, for example, they were locked in from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. with no toilets, and the sole nourishment was garlic soup!

Starting at Le Puy en Velay they crossed the high plateau of the Massif Central and followed the River Lot, a tributary of the Garonne, and traversed the Tarn district before reaching Toulouse. From here they approached the Pyrenees and, amazingly, managed to cross them in a day, seeing many golden eagles and finding the terrain easier than Scafell Pike! They indulged in the luxury of a taxi to carry their luggage by the road. Now in Spain, they reached Pamplona in the Navarra region and continued to Burgos. More mountain ranges had to be crossed in Galicia and so to their final goal, Santiago de Compostela, near Cape Finisterre, in whose beautiful cathedral is the ornate gilded tomb of St James. Legend has it that after his execution in 44 A.D. his body was taken by sea to Cape Finisterre and thence to Santiago, as he had done missionary work in Spain. The excellent slides showed the various stages of the journey through varied and beautiful scenery: mountains and valleys, picturesque villages and wayside shrines, and the winding tracks taken by thousands of pilgrims of many nations and creeds throughout the centuries, united by camaraderie and an experience shared.

What is Osteopathy ?

Having recently established an Osteopathic practice in Milnthorpe, it was suggested that I might write a small article about my work.

Osteopathy began in 1874. Its founder Dr Andrew Taylor Still intended it to be a complete system of medicine, having become disillusioned with the orthodox approach in which he had been trained, owing to its crudeness at that time.

Dr Still had a strong Christian faith and it was his belief that God would not have created a being in His own likeness, which was not perfect. This led him to look for underlying and predisposing causes to illness in his patients. He came to the conclusion that faults within the musculo-skeletal system were impeding the body's circulatory and nervous systems, to the extent that the body was not able to fight off disease. Although this seems simplistic, it proved very successful and the first British school of Osteopathy opened in 1917.

It is not accepted that joint and muscle problems, which are not resolved in a matter of weeks, begin to have a detrimental affect on the local circulatory and nervous systems which are associated with them. This interference of blood and nerve supply causes a deterioration of joint cartilage and ligaments as well as fibres within the muscles. Premature osteoarthritis can also develop. We understand a lot more about the immune system. An impeded circulation can indeed interfere with this making us more prone to problems, for example in the respiratory and digestive systems.

Today's Osteopaths not only learn the diagnostic and treatment techniques of the founder but also ways that these have been developed and improved upon in the ensuing 130 years. They are also trained in the systems of clinical methods and diagnosis used by modern day Doctors.

So, although people now usually consult an Osteopath for help with a joint or muscular problem, they can also receive constitutional benefits from the treatment.

Revision tips from 'Kip'

Every student in the country must take a National Test at some stage but if you're prepared there's no need to worry. It's time to plan ahead and set aside time for revision but before you start it's useful to know how you learn best as people learn in different ways.

When you spell do you try to 'see' the word in your mind, do you 'sound' out the word, or do you write it down on paper to see what it looks like? If you learn best by doing, then you are a kinaesthetic learner and you need to make your revision active by, for example, placing post-its with little bits of information all over the house.

Anxiety about exams is one of the main obstacles to success. To keep stress levels low prepare well to feel confident. Revise with other students to reassure you that you are not the only one who feels the way you do. Turn to teachers who can help you plan what areas you need to revise. Talk to someone you can trust like friends and family.

Like a top athlete, physically and mentally prepare yourself for what you have to do. Drink lots of water, exercise regularly and sleep well. GOOD LUCK.
