



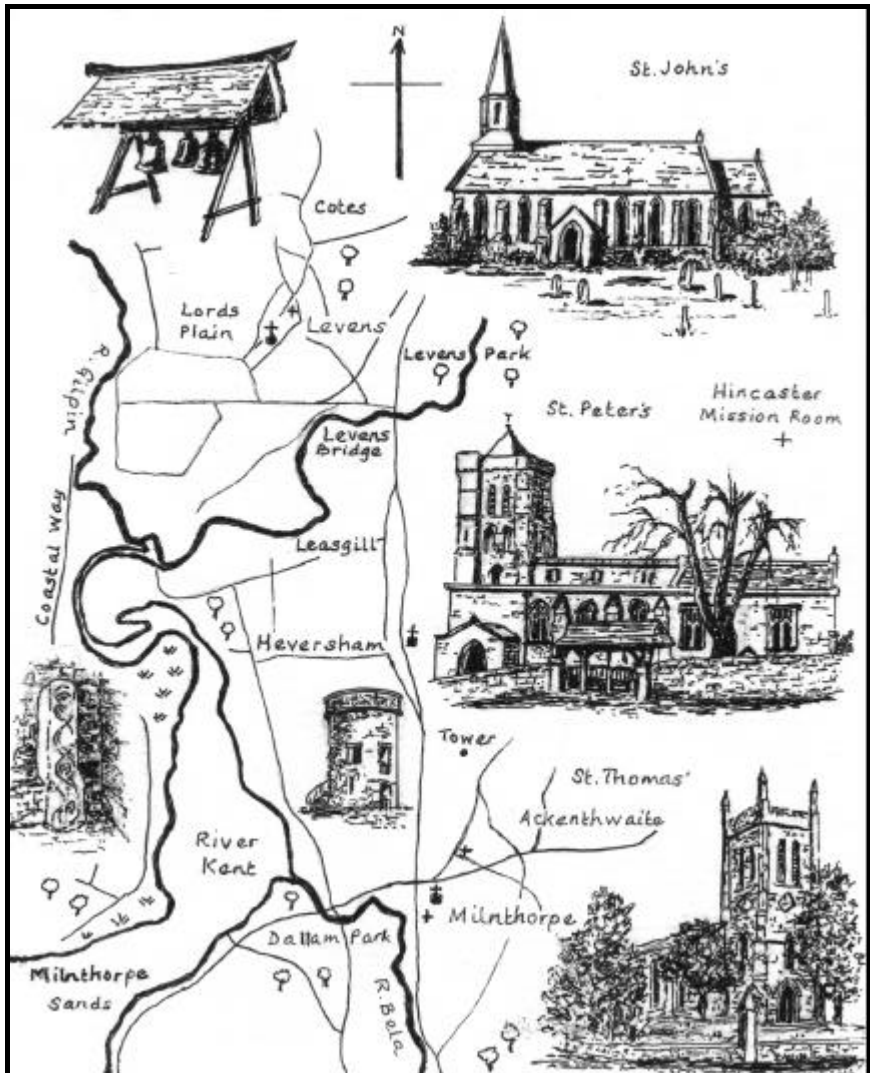

# This month's letter has been written by the Venerable Peter Dawson.

Dear Friends,

We were reminded in the February Parish News that the next edition would be on March 1st - Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent, lasting forty days and ending with the joy of Easter in spring-time.

Traditionally the forty days are intended to remind us of the period of that length when Jesus fasted in the isolation of the desert as a preparation for his public ministry.

But what of our observance of Lent today... often regarded as a rather dull and miserable period of self-denial with its negative 'giving up', often of small and innocent pleasures - to be replaced presumably by more positive pursuits on the one hand or ridiculous trivialities on the other . . . for example - cups of tea without sugar etc., etc.

However, there is a serious and productive way of observing Lent which relates to the priorities in the use of our time, and various churches in our district, as in Heversham, have planned gatherings in homes.

In Milnthorpe, encouraged by last year's success, we will be holding services in church at 7.30 pm prompt, lasting no more than 45 minutes and including hymns, prayers and a Bible based address in a series entitled 'FAITH IN ACTION' or 'EPISODES FROM ACTS'.

This is based on the Acts of the Apostles—in my own view the most thrilling and exciting book of the Bible with its account of the way in which the very first Christian believers conducted themselves, and pioneered a mission to the world which has continued ever since and to this day.

We look forward to inspiration and blessing, and hope that people not otherwise committed to a Lenten gathering elsewhere will feel free and warmly welcome to join us.

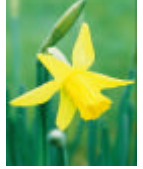

**LENT PROJECT 2006**  
**St. Peter's Heversham**  
**and St. Thomas' Milnthorpe**

The Lent Project for 2006 is to raise funds for **Kompas Park (Compass Park)** in **Khreshchatyk, Ukraine**. It is a former school building in grounds near a river, leased by Hope Now and owned by Ukrainian Christians which is to be turned initially into a Summer Activity Centre to hold the usual summer programmes for young people – camps, canoeing and much more! It has the name Kompas Park “**because we want it to be used to show children and young people the way to Life with a capital L**”. It may be used outside summer months as a Language School, giving young people the opportunity to learn foreign language skills and therefore find employment.

### Levens Over 60's Club

At the January meeting Mr E. Holwell took us on a welcome tour of sunny Spain! He & his family had toured there several times in the 1960s. We saw the vineyards, wild, parched countryside (now much changed by EU subsidies), where corn, often grown in the shade of trees, was threshed by bullocks; Don Quixote's windmills, and the great mountains of the Sierra Nevada. Despite centuries of invasions & wars much of Spain's wonderful architectural, artistic and cultural heritage survives. Roman bridges and aqueducts still stand, and the glories of the Islamic era were wisely preserved by Ferdinand & Isabella (whose descendant, Katharine of Aragon, unwisely married our Henry VIII) when they reconquered and unified Spain in the 1500s. We saw the beautiful, tranquil Alhambra & Alcazar gardens and buildings of the Moors, and the great ornate cathedrals of Toledo, Cordova, Burgos & Seville, where gypsies once lived in caves. A stunning finale was the little known collection of 18 vast tapestries depicting in gold thread the Spanish capture of Tunis in 1536, sent to King Charles V as a tribute from Brussels. We returned to winter in Levens via an unadvertised & interesting visit to Lourdes! We thanked Mr Holwell for yet another splendid slide show. Birthday flowers were presented to Mr Jackson.

## Prayer Ministry Training Weekend

On 4th-5th February, nine members of the regular congregation went to the Bishop's second training weekend at Cockermouth on Prayer Ministry. One of the most encouraging aspects for me was the fact that there were 102 delegates there from all over Cumbria. We were divided into groups of 6, each group led by an experienced counsellor, in both Christian and secular contexts, the best of both worlds.

### Levens Women's Institute

The December meeting took the form of a Christmas party with table games organised by Mrs Myra Knipe and a quiz organised by Mrs Audrey Larkins.

The speaker for the January meeting was Mrs Nancy Flynn, a native of New England, USA, now resident in Milnthorpe. She gave an interesting talk called 'England, my New England', contrasting her life in each place.

As a girl she was attracted to England by seeing planes in wartime 'going to help England', hearing her mother sing 'The White Cliffs of Dover' and reading 'Alice in Wonderland' and 'Jane Eyre'. She did not get here until 1983 but immediately fell in love with the southern English countryside and was later attracted to the North.

New England, in the N.E. corner of the USA, also possesses mountains, rivers and lakes, with miles of sandy beaches and is quite isolated from the rest of the USA Its winters are much colder than ours, however, lasting from mid-November to April, with frost 3 feet deep. Summer is hot and humid with heavy rain at times. The autumn colours are wonderful.

Mrs Flynn next gave a brief history of the region, showing how it had been a stronghold of Puritanism. The first white settlers came on the Mayflower in 1620 seeking religious freedom. Many died in the first winter, but the farmers learnt a lot from the Indians and by 1640 the population was 20,000. Each town was autonomous with its own laws and education and hospital facilities, and each had its own Meeting House. Each male member had an equal say but the rules were strict, the people very hard-working, and though they became prosperous they were not ostentatious with their wealth but were well educated. Harvard and other famous colleges were founded there and there were many public benefactors of libraries, museums, etc. Gradually, Irish and other nationalities moved in and practised their own religions, and the days of strict Puritanism are now over. Gone too are the once prosperous mills and a lot of urban renewal has taken place. Architecture is simple but attractive.
