



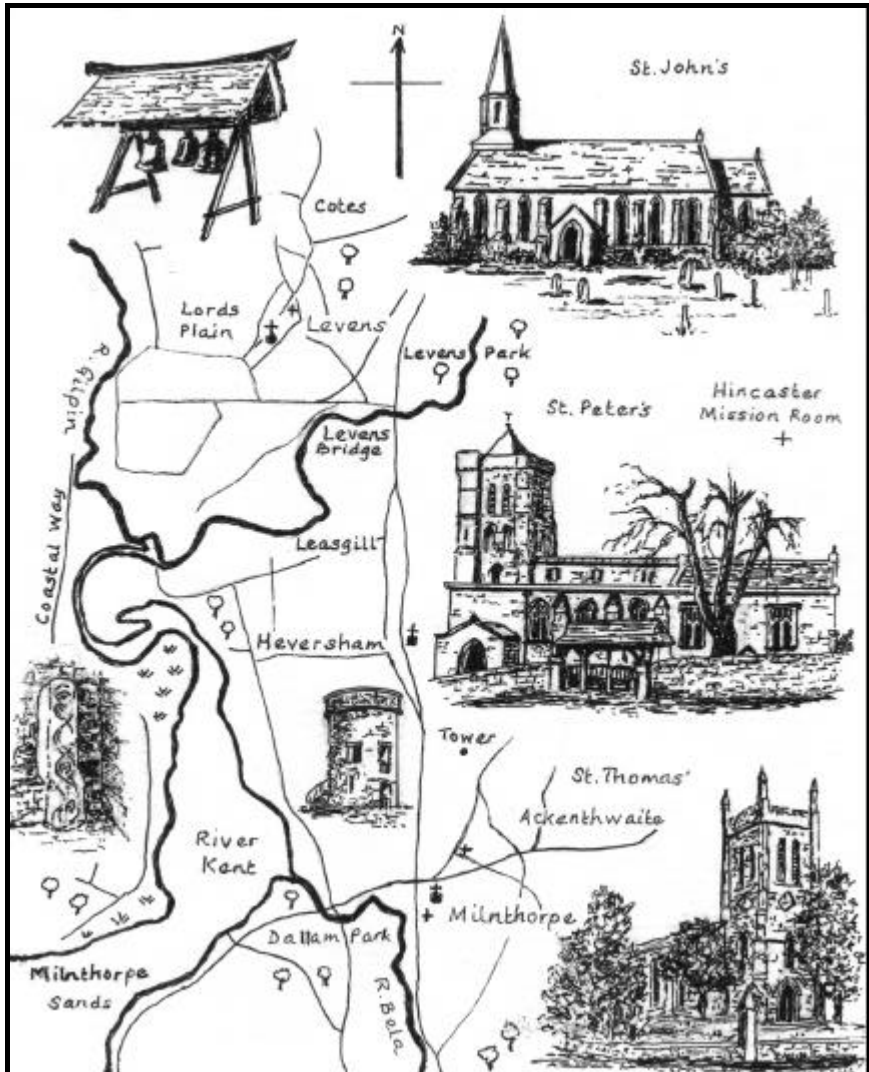

# This month's Pastoral Letter has been written by The Reverend Ruth Crossley

## How big is your God?

Do you have a view of what God is like? My grandson recently said to me 'there is only one God isn't there Grandma? and he is bigger than anything!'

We all too often bring God down to our size, we try to contain God in the world we understand, and in effect make God our comfort blanket.

I wouldn't want to suggest that God is not always there for us, and that God doesn't give us guidelines on how to live but if that is all God is to us then our God is too small.

The Hitch Hikers Guide to the Galaxy and The Calling of a Cuckoo, by David Jenkins, (onetime Bishop of Durham) are two books I read recently. They both, in their own way try to answer these questions:

*'what does it mean to be human?' and 'what is the meaning of life?'*

One uses comical yet truth-seeking stories and among other ideas and answers comes up with the meaning of life as being 42, (*if you haven't read the book then you will need to, to understand this*).

David Jenkins speaks of the meaning of life and the mystery of being human as having something to do with God and his love for the world and its people. God's love, something which is almost incomprehensible, transforming love, life giving love, this is the mystery that is God.

This is God's love. So immense, and made evident among us now in the power of the Holy Spirit, which works in us, through us and around us, transforming lives and communities.

Some of you may remember a chorus which talks of God's love:

*So high, you can't get over it, so wide you can't get round it*

*So deep you can't get under it, oh wonderful love.*

God is big enough to cope with our doubts, our insecurities, our worries; God is big enough to love each one of us and he asks each of us to love him, love ourselves and love our neighbours. How big is your God?

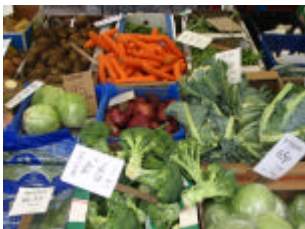

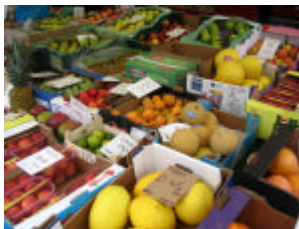

## **Milnthorpe St Thomas's Tower**

As everybody will by now doubtless be aware, there is a problem with the tower at St Thomas's. Early in July we noticed that a crack had appeared in the north-west corner of the tower, extending into the top of the north-west buttress. We quickly got our architect, Paul Grout, and a structural engineer to examine the tower, and it was agreed that a more detailed survey would be needed to establish the cause of the crack and the general state of the tower structure. That detailed survey is due to be completed in mid-August.

Meanwhile it has been decided that the area around the north-west corner of the tower must remain cordoned off, that the bells must not be rung, and that the clock chiming mechanism cannot be used since the heavy weight that drives it is suspended from a beam in the north-west corner of the tower. The clock is still going, and the hour striking mechanism is still functioning, since the weights that drive these are much smaller and are located at the other side of the tower.

We hope that the detailed survey of the tower will not reveal any drastic problems, and that the crack can be quickly repaired. But we must await the recommendations of the architect's report
