# This month's Pastoral Letter has been written by The Reverend Susan Wilson

Dear Friends,

'Why have you come to our school?'

'Well, I'm practising to be a teacher,' one of the students replied.

'But we're not practising,' replied the four year old!

Every September at the start of the new school year, as a teacher, I was struck afresh by the enthusiasm of the new wave of children joining the school and forcefully reminded, that young children are not practising for adult life, they are living in the here and now; small people, yes, but with much to teach us - the grown ups.

When the disciples were bickering amongst themselves, Jesus cut through their ill temper with the words,

'Unless you change and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven.' What God wants us to be as adults, is not *childish*, but *child – like*.

Children receive what they need to live; they have to trust because they are dependant on others. In the same way, we need to know our dependence on God, not only for the gift of existence itself, but also for the fact that he has promised life in all its fullness to those who follow him.

Children are constantly growing and changing and children of God must grow too. As Nicodemus, someone who knew Jesus discovered, we can start that new life at any age. Being a child of God is about a *childlike* relationship with God in terms of dependency and trust, not a *childish* one.

As no two children in any human family are the same, so too, each child of God is different but equal. God has no favourites! We are each unique, and yet as part of God's family we need each other. Love, both within the family, and beyond, may not come easily, but it is love, which marks us out as children of God.

Love is a whisper, not a tornado.

Love is a drift of petals, not a mighty oak tree.

Love is the song of a flute, not the blast of a trumpet.

Love is the beckoning finger, not a pair of handcuffs.

This is its strength.

It invites,

It does not force.

It's like a camp fire.

We gather round and are warmed.

At the July meeting Bryan Dawson's talk "The language of the Lakes" was a most entertaining "one man show", with dialect word quizzes, poems & songs. Bryan considers that the various Cumbrian dialects are really a regional language, as their mixture of words of Celtic & Old Norse origins has quite different words than the standard English for the same things. He also believes that the Norse settlers who named our hills & valleys "Fells" and "Dales" also named the native sheep Herdwyicks", which are probably as Celtic as the words (yan, tan, tethera ... ) still used not long ago to count them, as were some local words for weights and measures of farm produce. If you'd like to have a go at reading "t'auld Cumbrian twang", get a copy of the Journal of the Lakeland Dialect Society 2005/2006 at Levens Post Office, only £1.50! 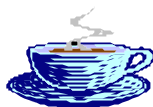

She will have a shared office there and will be working to facilitate the translation projects in the southern part of Togo and Benin. **Please pray for her health** ( Lomé is on the coast and there is a great risk of malaria ), for her **safety in the house** in which she is living (Lomé and Togo can be dangerous places, from a political and a lawlessness point of view ) and for her **safety on the roads** which are often very poor and dangerous.

Bibi often sends us updates and prayer requests by e-mail. Please let me know if you would like copies of these or give me your e-mail address so that I can forward them to you.

### **Levens Women's Institute**

Despite holidays there was quite a good attendance at the August meeting to hear Mrs O'Neill give an amusing and informative talk entitled "A funny thing happened in India". This was an account of how she accompanied her husband on a business trip to India in 1994. They were staying at Mangalore on the west coast and she was free to visit tourist attractions such as the swimming pool shared with a baboon, crocodiles and a large snake at the zoo; scary but fascinating. She travelled by train to the southernmost tip of India, and discovered that Indian women have more freedom the further south one goes. The position of women in general gave concern; rich women were not allowed to work, however well-educated they were, so they lived rather sterile lives, while poor women worried about the size of their dowry and were often ill-treated, especially by their mothers-in-law. A visit to Goa and the Spice Coast, where they saw snake-charmers, concluded this account. No slides were shown but the vivid descriptions, humorous anecdotes and expressive gestures more than made up for this, and a photo album passed round illustrated the colour, variety and at times pathos of this fascinating land.
