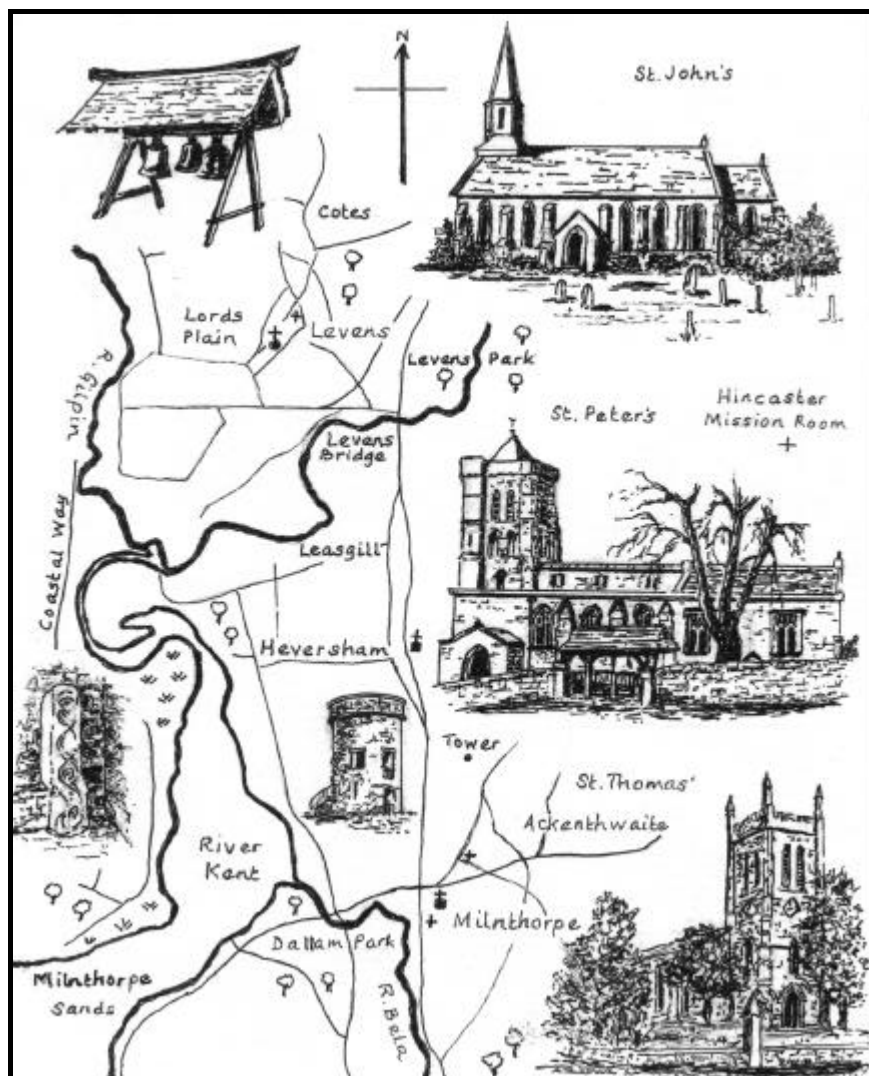

This month's Pastoral Letter is from The Reverend Susan Wilson

Dear Friends,

Imagine a world.....

Imagination is a precious gift, perhaps uniquely given to God's human creation – us! It gives us the power to see things differently, not only to name and catalogue the evidence of our senses, but also to frame our conclusions about the 'if onlys...' of the past and to speculate on the 'what ifs' of the future.

Fantasy through film is something we're used to seeing.....Lord of the Rings or the latest Harry Potter. Fantasy books such as the Pullman novels, 'His Dark Materials' scoop awards. The list of films and books depicting a fantasy world that we could come up with is endless.

So why is there such an interest in fantasy worlds, when our imaginative powers might be so much more usefully applied to finding ways of changing the world we do live in, into the one we would so much rather inhabit?

Imagine a world where men and women are accorded equal status and opportunity; where people of different faiths and ethnic groups live in harmony; where we have renounced armed conflict as a way of settling scores; where the life and teaching of Jesus are the model for human living and no-one feels excluded. I believe this is the sort of world we would all much rather see.

People living locally, as well as large organisations that operate across the world, are seeking to work to make this dream of our imaginations become reality. Can we help too? Do we only support at times of crisis? Maybe we could look at how we can use our skills, our time, our money and our prayers to help turn vision into reality here and now.

Perhaps our prayer for changing the world around us into the one we would like to see could be-

Take our hatreds: make them into handshakes.
Take our prejudices: make them into peace offerings
Take our arguments: make them into alliances
Take our battles: make them into bonds
Take our misunderstandings: make them into music
Take our divisions: make them into dances
Take our schisms: make them into songs.

Perhaps all we really need to remember is that change begins with us – our attitudes and our actions!

The Lent Project for 2007

in St. Peter's Heversham and St. Thomas' Milnthorpe is to support "Walk Cumbria" under the banner of "Through Faith Missions".



Walk missions have been taking place since 1991, and from May 5th – 13th a team of people will be working in our 2 parishes. Their aim is to work with our churches, sharing the Good News of Jesus with people living in Heversham and Milnthorpe. The team members will go out to meet people "on their own turf" where the non-Christian feels comfortable, to share the Gospel in one-to-one conversations and by preaching so that "many may hear and believe."

The team members will stay in the area. Our 2 churches are responsible for the costs incurred, including accommodation, food and in particular resources which will amount to £1500.

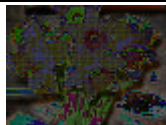

Deanery Day –

Encountering Islam

On 12 February at Arnside, the Revd David Cooper held a daylong workshop for the deanery on Encountering Islam. It was well attended from across the deanery and was excellently structured to give us a deeper, more balanced, understanding of the beliefs of Muslims and to realise more of how the Islamic community as a whole see their own faith and how they regard Christianity and Christ. Building on this, we were able to consider how we might talk with members of the Muslim community, respecting identity and avoiding the dangers of both extreme Islamic fanaticism and extreme Islamophobia, and perhaps scrutinising – and so strengthening - our perceptions of our own faith and practice more deeply. A day of great value in both respects.
