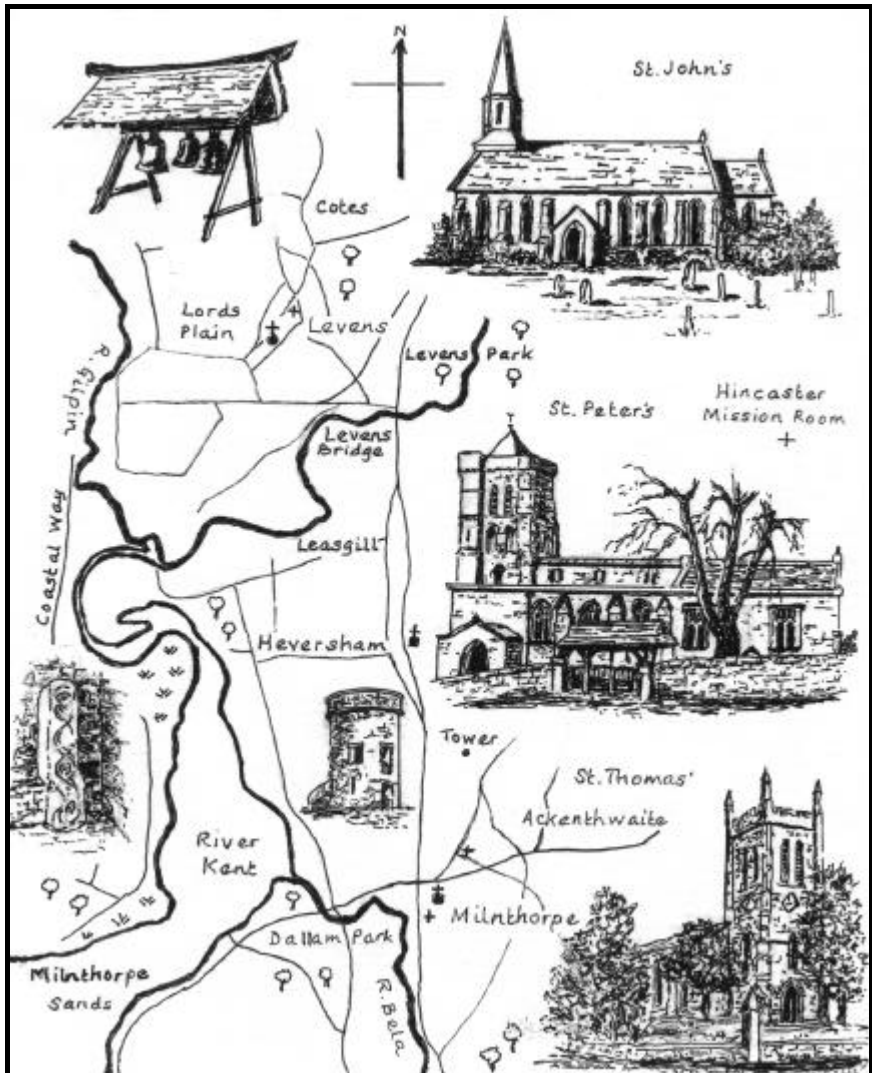

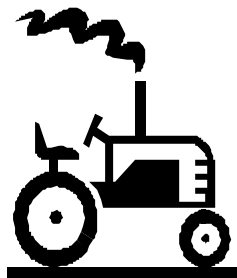

GREEK EVENING, 17 MARCH

About 40 people attended a Greek Evening at St Thomas's Church Centre. A meal of Greek style food was followed by an entertaining and informative talk from John Thorley. He told his hearers that Greeks today in Greek Orthodox churches still hear and understand the New Testament in the original Greek, written over 1,900 years ago – whereas we in 21st century England find difficulty with Chaucer's Canterbury Tales, written only 600 years ago. Through various interesting examples John showed how some Greek words and phrases in the New Testament have been inaccurately translated in our English bible from the Authorised Version through to the most modern translations. Though many of us are very attached to the beautiful cadences of the Authorised (King James) Version of the Bible, unfortunately it often does not convey the essentially colloquial language of the original Greek.

The March meeting of the Milnthorpe with Heversham Mothers' Union began with a reflective period of quiet music with spring flowers (sic) followed by prayers and service by Leader Joan Ellam, with a Bible reading by Mary Orr. Three visitors were welcomed along with guest speaker, Judy Slater, who fascinated all present with her talk, with slides, entitled 'Hearing dogs for the Deaf'. She told how each dog gave companionship for an independent life, alerting its owner to everyday sounds or danger signals, and she gave the history of various dog owners. The dogs, often unwanted or from homes, were chosen for their friendliness and sociability. The lives of so many people have been changed since training began in 1982, 2007 being the Hearing Dogs 25th Anniversary.

Members have attended the Women's World Day of Prayer service at Christ the King, the Diocesan Wave of Prayer at the home of member, Linda Cooper, and the Lady Day service at St Peter's. LEVENS VILLAGE PLAN

WHAT IS IT? WHY DO IT? THE BENEFITS

Creating a village plan for **Levens** will enable everyone to take a comprehensive look at our village, its services, its facilities, its needs and aspirations for the future. By canvassing everyone's views a vision can be developed of what issues are most important, how new development can be incorporated, what could be changed, and the standards we would like to see in our village. The plan will reflect the views and feelings of villagers, and will in turn inform local authorities, planners and other statutory bodies of local issues, and the wishes of everyone in our community.

The content of the questionnaire is being worked on at the moment.

Please give any suggestions. Through the plan we can have a say in how services for our village are managed, and we can raise awareness of the environmental and social issues that most affect us. Hopefully the plan will give rise to better communication within the village, and give us clearer objectives that will reflect everyone's views.

Prompted by Levens Parish Council, an initial local committee has been set up which represents many village organizations. They are working on the best way to gain the views of **EVERYONE** in the village including all ages, businesses, local groups and any other agencies that serve the village. Consultation will take place mainly through a questionnaire to adults and to businesses, a special fun day for older children, and a primary school project. The responses will be analysed, the plan will be published, and work can then start on identifying possible action. The plan will be shared with all the relevant local authorities.

Through this plan we can ALL influence local authorities, service providers and planners. It will help us to think through and hopefully carry out development in areas where it is most needed. The questionnaire exercise will encourage everyone to express their views and to think about the future of the village and how it can be improved for the benefit of all the residents.

The content of the questionnaire is being worked on at the moment.

Please give any suggested questions to your group representative who has a sheet to fill in.

Think of what concerns you, what you feel is good in the village, why you like living here, what you would like changed or improved your suggestions will help everyone so please use every opportunity to let us know what questions you would like to be asked. We hope to receive questions as soon as possible so that we can incorporate them in the final questionnaire.

Levens Women's Institute



met on 20th February. After the normal business meeting which included notice of a proposed litter pick around the village at the end of March and the latest news of the progress of the Parish Plan [see on page 11 in this Parish News], Mrs Fiona Cartmell spoke on the work of the British and of the International, Red Cross, since they cannot really be separated. The Red Cross is the largest charity in the world, and is entirely neutral and impartial in all aspects of life and never takes sides. The only qualification needed to be in receipt of its help is to be a suffering human being. Some countries have found it difficult to work in an organisation whose badge is a cross so, quite some time ago, the Red Crescent came into being and, much more recently, the Red Crystal too. Mrs Cartmell, who works as a volunteer for the Red Cross, spoke at some length on the various aspects of its work and had her audience completely enthralled.

Levens Bowling Club

Thank you to everyone who supported our Coffee Morning and our Quiz. As a result, £485 and £150 respectively have been added to our funds, which will help us to purchase fertilisers and other materials in order to keep the bowling green in good condition. The bowling green is a village amenity open to all. The Bowling club would like to encourage everyone to try the game, and will be offering introductory sessions on Wednesday afternoons and evenings from the first week in May, when guidance and equipment will be available – first session free, and a 50% discount on the club membership fee for the first year.

The Club has eight teams in four different leagues, with matches on Monday afternoons, Monday and Tuesday evenings and alternate Thursday and Friday evenings. The league programme begins on Friday 6 April, and spectators are welcome at all fixtures.

Levens Over 60s' Club Illness and inclement weather somewhat diminished the attendance at our February meeting, but those who were able to attend enjoyed a treat, as Enid Holmes gave a talk on the life of Joyce Grenfell and used her own acting skills to deliver some of the humorous monologues for which she was famous. These included "Useful and Acceptable Gifts", speaking to a W.I., "A Village Mother" and the well-known "Nursery School Teacher" one.

She was born into a well-connected family; her mother was an American, Nancy Lady Astor was her cousin. At the age of twelve she decided to be an actress. She started as a radio music critic, in 'Face the Music', showing her great knowledge of music. After the war, her career really took off. She rehearsed in front of the mirror. She crossed the Atlantic many times, often in the company of Lady Astor, and enjoyed performing on board. She was born in 1910, married Reggie when only nineteen, and died of cancer in 1969. Although her monologues show a deep understanding of children, she never had any of her own.
