Dear Friends,

It struck me recently how much God must love difference.

I stood watching a fisherman at Sandside and as I watched the water I imagined the creatures the water had carried on its journey here. Consider for a minute the huge variety of life that swims in the oceans – from microscopic plankton to the blue whales up to 30 metres long. Even plankton, on which all sea creatures ultimately depend for their food, come in many shapes and often have beautiful and complex structures.

God has created all humanity too with a huge variety of colour, skills and adaptations to our various situations.

I cannot believe that God wants us all to try to be the same, to do things in the same way, or to worship God in the same way. I believe God delights in our diversity. What joy God must experience in a toddler singing ‘Twinkle, twinkle little star’, in a 200 strong choir of trained voices singing ‘The Messiah’, in drums, in silence, in beautifully created art or in wood carving. The list is endless, but all are of equal delight to God when offered in wonder, love and praise.

As I look forward to the Milnthorpe art exhibition again this year, - pencil, paint, pastel, oil, sculpture; observation and imagination - a visual feast, celebrating difference, it’s a wonderful reminder that our God is a God of creativity and diversity.

Being open to difference in others with an expectation of experiencing God through the difference can bring such joy and teach us so much about God. This last year, it has been such a privilege to listen to people with experiences different from my own, to see how people have received such blessings through different ways of life and worship. As God is a God of diversity, how diverse are the experiences we dare to ‘swim with’ as we open our eyes and look for new ways of glimpsing God?

To correct a misunderstanding

During the Walk Cumbria survey it came to our notice that several people in the village are under the impression that a large proportion of monies donated at funerals held at St Thomas' is kept by the Church and not given to the intended charity. We would like to point out that only 10% of any cash given (not cheques) has ever been retained. This is the standard recommended fee for collecting and banking the monies. HOWEVER - as this issue has obviously caused a great deal of distress, the Church Council has decided that in future this fee will be waived and ALL monies collected will be donated to the charity chosen by the bereaved family.

June's Guest speaker was Anne Laycock, leader of Torrisholme MU, who spoke about the Ebenezer Emergency Fund International, which demonstrates the MU theme of Faith In Action. Her uplifting talk was entitled 'Strawberries for Breakfast' and described the work done by the Fund and one woman's experience of fulfilling God's promise to Israel. The Ebenezer Fund was 'born' in 1991 by Gustav Scheller at the International Prayer Conference at Jerusalem and has assisted in bringing back thousands of Jewish people to Israel, firstly from Russia and now aiming to return thousands of Jews, scattered worldwide in 25 countries, to Israel. Mr and Mrs Laycock visited Israel after their marriage and for years have assisted in the settling of immigrants, working especially at a Distribution Centre for necessities. Before setting out each morning Anne would sit down to enjoy a bowl of fresh strawberries!

Holehird Gardens

There was a good attendance at Levens Over 60s Club for the visit of Mr Peter Hoggarth, who gave an excellent slide-talk on Holehird Gardens, taking us through a typical year from early spring to the next winter. The mansion, built in 1840 by brewers from Manchester, is now let to the Cheshire Homes, but the Lakeland Horticultural Society took over the gardens. We were surprised to hear they have 1800 members worldwide, of whom 100 work in the gardens. The soil is stony and with 70" of rain a year tends to get washed away. The hillside garden at the top was converted from an orchard. The walled garden, formerly for fruit and vegetables, was taken over in a dilapidated state and is now a much visited display area. An alpine house was provided and much propagation takes place. Workers are delegated to specific areas, while the "Heavy Gang" do the hard maintenance work. Students come on bursaries from Newton Rigg.

We saw the famous collections of astilbes, heathers and 200 different varieties of rhododendrons, masses of colour in the rock gardens, camellias, Madeira orchids, Himalayan blue poppies, witch hazel, the handkerchief tree and much more. At the Millennium, the Society took over the lower garden, which has a water theme. They won a gold award for their stand at Holker show. Mr Hoggarth added lots of humour to his talk, answered various questions, and was thanked by Mr Peter Edwards.

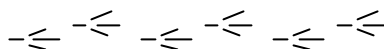

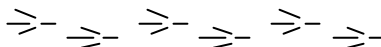
